Our monthly meetings were well attended and benching was a sight to see and showed our guests and visitors a great range in orchids. The store was utilized by our members well above what we expected and some months we even ran out of some products. To me this is what the store is all about, giving back to the members the benefit of the cheapest products and quality products like I tell potential members their joining fee is returned in savings they make with there first purchase the store is run for the benefit of members but not for the profit of members so therefore the committee brought the rule in that members could only buy 3 bags of bark at each monthly meeting.

Our stores small profit you can say went towards prize money for our winter and spring shows which had no sponsors this year, all prize money came from our society's coffers. Our spring show was last year sponsored by Stockland and this is where I will take the blame for assuming they would do the same but unfortunately I did not ask and just assumed they would do the same for 2013. When I realized it was too late to approach them about sponsorship, but I won't be so slow this coming year. So the society paid all prize money and keeping with our committees aims of giving as much back to the members as possible we also increased the end of year money ratio.

I would like to say a few words about growing our society and this is not only to our new members, but also to our long serving members. We call our society "the friendly society" and we promote this as much as we can. Let me throw a couple of old sayings at you - share the load, many hands make light work and lend a hand. With this in mind things like setting up the hall and supper are easy things to help with and also shows our guests and visitors that we are all here to grow our society. Plenty of times I have seen our ladies trying to move chairs and tables while our men are standing around talking.
